PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

PRHS Community,

We are off to a great start of a new school year. I would like to thank you for all the support you have given to the school over the past month. In this time we held our annual Freshmen Orientation Meeting, had a great LINK day for freshmen and our first all-school assembly. Other first month activities included the Back to School Night, Senior Sunrise, sophomore and senior class meetings, and the senior picture and barbeque. Academically, a practice PSAT & SAT test was conducted for freshman, sophomores and juniors. All these things could not happen without the teachers, students, and parents contributing in many different ways.

We will continue to use a quarterly format for the school newsletter this year. Our next newsletter will be in January, so please continue to monitor our school website for current and upcoming school events. The newsletter is one of the best ways to be connected to our school and all the upcoming events.

Our student enrollment at this time is around 1,170 making this largest student population we have had to start school with. Our enrollment from outside the district continues to increase each year. We are happy to host eight foreign exchange students from several different countries including the Republic of Georgia, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, and Germany. We also have three new certified teachers in our building who bring great experience and energy to our existing excellent staff.

I continue to be impressed with how many of our students are involved in a variety of activities outside of school. The memories created in extra-curricular activities will remain for a lifetime. I would also encourage all parents to get involved in our school community. When parents and students are both connected to our school, the potential is unlimited for the success our students can have. Parents can volunteer as guest speakers and mentors, serve on district committees, and assist at school functions. At the start of each year, traffic in all the lots can be a problem. I respectfully continue to ask **that parents who drop students off before or pick up after school do so carefully. It is crucial that parents use the pick-up lane after pschool in the upper parking lot next to the main entrance. It is also helpful when parents abide by the posted signs in No Parking and Drop Off zones.** I'm very concerned that a student, staff member or other pedestrian will be hit when caution and signs are not followed in our parking areas. Parents who prefer to use the parking lot instead of the drop off lane are encouraged to park in the lot in the painted parking spaces while they are waiting for or dropping off their child. We truly appreciate your cooperation and effort to ensure our parking lots stay safe for our students, staff and community.

As the new school year begins for your son or daughter, it is important that communication is established between you and their teachers. I encourage all parents and guardians to communicate with your student's teachers. Check Infinite Campus and the teachers' websites on at www.lewispalmer.org/prhs weekly. Please review our school website for a variety of ways you can connect with our staff and keep up with all the activities going on in our school. If questions occur in your student's class, **first contact** the teacher. Building trust between the parents and teachers early on is important to the success of your child. If you contact the teacher but are not able to resolve the issue, then contact the appropriate administrator. I firmly believe 99% of our conflicts can be resolved when all the parties are involved in an appropriate manner.

Each year, I continue to feel grateful and blessed to work in a school where there is so much community support. You as parents/guardians have given supplies, time, and resources for our Senior Sunrise, assisted on processing days, given monetarily through the adoption program to teachers and the library, and have landscaped and cleaned up the grounds. Your support is always present, and random acts of kindness take place here every day because of your efforts. They are too numerous to list, and we appreciate you!

I encourage you to please come in and see for yourself the great things that are happening at Palmer Ridge. I hope to see you at a school activity, community engagement gathering, or our parent advisory meeting in the near future.

Ordering Transcripts for College and Scholarships

Seniors! This is an exciting year for you and it is not too early to start working on your post-grad plans! If you are applying to colleges or for scholarships, you will need to send transcripts. Transcript cost \$5 each and can be ordered from **Mrs. Motta** in the front office.

Guidelines:

- Transcripts will be sent to colleges electronically through Naviance. When you are ready to send your transcript to a college, log into Naviance and add your college to the **Colleges I'm Applying To Tab**. After adding your college, click the **Request Transcript** link.
- If you are using Common App for your college application, you will also need to complete the Common App matching process in Naviance.
- Once you have placed your college info in Naviance, see Mrs. Motta to pay for each transcript.
- Paper copies of transcripts for scholarships may also be ordered from Mrs. Motta.

Please be aware of your college/scholarship application deadlines and plan ahead – I do request 2 business days to process transcript requests. **If you need transcripts sent before either the Thanksgiving or Winter Break – you will need to order them no later than 3:00 p.m. on the Wednesday before the break. (This is really important if you have a December 1 deadline or a January 1 deadline!)** If you have any questions, you may call me at 719-867-8602.

Early Release Request for Students

Early release from class must be requested by a parent or guardian by calling the appropriate attendance secretary or sending a note at the beginning of the school day. Please try to anticipate early releases as instruction is interrupted for all students if we have to send someone to class to get a student, and it is very hard to track down a student who is at lunch. If a student misses 45 minutes or more of class because of an early release, it will count as an absence and be included in absences for documentation.

PLEASE NOTE: Parents need to write a note for early dismissal for appointments during the school day. Students must take that note to the appropriate attendance secretary the MORNING of their appointment and the secretary will give them a pass to be excused from class for their appointment. This will ensure that your students will be ready for you when you arrive to pick them up. Last minute calls for early dismissal of your student to the attendance secretaries makes it very difficult to get students out in a timely manner. Please be advised that you will most likely have a wait time.

Honors English 1 News

Each year our Honors English 1 classes study Ayn Rand's novella *Anthem* and enter an international essay contest sponsored by the Ayn Rand Institute as a culminating activity.

The *Anthem* contest, open to grades 8-10, is one of the largest essay contest programs in the world with more than 14,000 submissions from more than one hundred countries each year. For the 2016 contest Palmer Ridge had four semi-finalists: **Weston Dall**, **Madeleine Huffman**, **Owen Logsdon**, and **Katelynn Salmon**. The fact that they have earned a ranking, places their essays in the top 2 percent of all essays received, and they each earned a \$30 prize. I should note that LPHS recently joined us in this competition, and they also had a semi-finalist for 2016.

Additionally, Weston Dall's entry into the 2016 Anthem Essay Contest has been chosen as the winner for the Regional Colorado contest! Out of the more than 400 entrants from Colorado, his essay has proven to be the best. As a result, he has won the top prize of \$500! Congratulations, Weston, and to our other winners!

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What's coming up in **SEPTEMBER?**

Counselors will meet with the Freshmen Prep classes to start on their Individualized Career and Academic Plans (ICAP) using Naviance. Students will activate their accounts and learn about their personality type as it relates to career matching. Codes will be sent home to families afterward so parents/guardians can register their own account and see their student's ICAP and career matching results. Activities will continue throughout the year to expand their individual plans.

Students' first official grade posting will hit Infinite Campus in September. Since report cards are not sent home, Infinite Campus is the best way to stay informed about your students' progress. Keep encouraging your students to communicate with their teachers to address their areas of concern. Please help coach them through their struggles. Counselors will also be meeting with any students who have multiple failing grades. As always, please team with teachers, counselors, and administrators to find the resources necessary to help your student be successful.

Juniors and seniors can discuss with their counselors about their fit for PR's concurrent enrollment program for Spring 2017. Students can pursue college courses that are not offered in the school and that align with their ICAP for dual credit. The deadline for submitting the initial intent form is October 1. For more information as well as the intent form, please visit the Counseling website under College & Career, Concurrent Enrollment.

What's coming up in **OCTOBER?**

As a follow up to the September senior class meeting, counselors will meet individually with seniors to help them with their post-secondary planning and/or college application process. New this year is the FAFSA timeline, to begin October 1 instead of the traditional date of January 1. Look for local FAFSA Workshops to be advertised in the Counseling Announcements for personalized help navigating this financial aid process!

College Fairs will be in full swing in October. These fairs provide great opportunities to make an impression with and learn more about different colleges from college admissions representatives. D38 is offering its own fair on October 27th from 6-7:30 p.m. at Lewis Palmer High School. Southern Colorado's Out-of-State College Fair is on September 26th at the Freedom Financial Expo Center. Check out www.gotocollegefairs.com to register once with potential schools instead of filling out endless contact cards at each college's table. Additionally, you can find out information on additional college fairs occurring in Colorado.

October is College in Colorado's college application month. See www.ciccollegeappmonth.org to learn more about their promotional \$1000 scholarship offered weekly to encourage college-going seniors to get those applications done early!

The next best opportunity to meet with your student's teachers is coming soon. Parent/Teacher Conferences will be offered October 13th and 19th in the Main Gym from 5-7:30pm. Just five minutes spent with your student's teachers can reveal much about your student's strengths and areas for improvement.

On October 19th, PRHS is offering the **optional** PSAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test for juniors. The deadline to sign up is October 5th. Registration will be available in Naviance. The cost for the test is \$25 and must be paid to reserve a spot.

IMPORTANT: ATTENTION Parents!**Student Messages/Drop-off Items**

Students are receiving messages from parents/guardians while school is in session. In consideration of teachers, students, and staff, we are requesting that parents make arrangements with their students for after-school plans before they leave for school. **Please note that when a note is delivered, it not only interrupts your student's learning time but also everyone else's in the class.** Students are expected to be prepared for school on a daily basis. No student to student messages will be taken! Please be aware that when a message or lunch is left for a student, it does not guarantee the student will receive his/her message. Another great way to communicate with your student is by text messaging him/her as students are able to check messages during lunch provided that they are not in the academic wing of the school. There is a courtesy phone located in the front office for student to use for emergencies. The student must request permission from front office personnel prior to using the courtesy phone.

If your student knows something is being dropped off, it is your **student's responsibility** to check with Campus Security and pick up the item(s). Messages will not be sent to students for dropped off items. Thank you for your cooperation.

Cell Phone Usage

Students are not allowed to use cell phones for calls or texting during the school day as they disrupt the education environment. Students may use their phones before/after school and during their lunch. Please be aware that if students are using a phone during the school day in the academic wing, they risk the phone being confiscated until the end of the day. Repeated phone offenses will result in detention and parents will be asked to pick up the phone.

If a student is ill, the student must report to class and get a pass from the teacher to visit the nurse's office. The nurse/health clerk will then have the student call home if they're not well enough to stay in school for the day.

Attendance Check-In Procedures

Students returning to the building or arriving during the school day are required to check-in with Campus Security before proceeding to the grade level secretary for a pass to class.

Attendance Check-Out Procedures

When students need to check out during the school day, parents must call or send a note to the appropriate secretary before the time the student is to leave. The student is responsible for picking the pass up from the secretary before the dismissal time. Students then show the pass to the teacher for dismissal and give it to Campus Security when exiting the building.

PLEASE NOTE: Parents need to write a note for early dismissal for appointments during the school day. Students must take that note to the appropriate attendance secretary the morning of their appointment and the secretary will give them a pass to be excused for their appointment. This will ensure that your students will be ready for you when you arrive to pick them up.

Illness of Students: Students who are absent because of illness will be marked "excused" only upon notification by a parent/guardian to the grade level secretary (see above for grade level office to call). Calls can be made 24 hours a day by using the voice mail system. Parents/guardians have two days (48 hours) after an absence to clear or excuse an absence. If contact with the school is not made within two days after the absence, it may remain unexcused. A student who has excessive absences in a class or classes may be required by an administrator to provide documentation to excuse any further absence. Please refer to the PRHS Student Handbook.

Parents may request homework for students who will be absent two (2) or more days by calling the appropriate grade level telephone line.
